In our 10th year, we expanded beyond our Minnesota roots to serve Caregivers across the U.S. and Canada. And we made our biggest impact yet—keeping our core programs strong while launching two groundbreaking new initiatives:

- The Storm Chaser Our new mobile kitchen (think food truck, but with more heart) helps volunteers bring encouragement to Caregivers, one meal at a time.
- <u>CaregiverCON</u> A first-of-its-kind conference bringing together a growing movement of people and organizations who believe non-professional Caregivers deserve to feel seen and supported.

Now, we have set our sights on the impact we will make in our next decade—strengthening one million caregiving men.

Rethinking Strength

Eric Schleuter - Justin Nicolay Resilience Award

I remember the first time I spoke with Eric. It was right after his wife died. Eric had scheduled me for an online intake meeting, and, like a lot of first-timers, he didn't show. Being resilient myself, I looked up his phone number and called him. Some guys aren't ready. But with a little coaxing, Eric was. We talked for a good hour, and it was pretty obvious that Eric was dedicated to actively participating in his grief journey. He shared that he lost not only his wife, but also his best friend and his childhood sweetheart. Devastating, to be sure.

Eric is a regular at our Sequel Maker Klatch, a support group we hold right upstairs for those who have lost a loved one. He is candid about his grief journey and is unflinchingly supportive of his fellow attendees. The key to Eric's resilience is giving back. He volunteers with the U of M. He's a fierce advocate for fellow Caregivers at his workplace and has recently agreed to be a Klatch leader himself. Toni Kay Mangskau – Kyle Woody Courage Award

On April 26th, 2025, Caregivers and community partners serving them gathered in Rochester, Minnesota for CaregiverCONx Southeast. Everything from programming to logistics was made possible by Toni and the unwavering courage she brings to every battle she fights.

Her journey began with the challenges of caregiving within her own family, supporting her children through serious health issues, and later stepping into the role of Caregiver for other family members. She has experienced firsthand the emotional and financial burdens that so many Caregivers face, and rather than being defeated by these hardships, she has become a powerful voice for change.

Toni has spent decades fighting for health care reform, caregiving support, and social justice. Whether she's organizing community events to connect Caregivers with vital resources, advising national organizations like the National Patient Advocate Foundation, or testifying before lawmakers on the importance of paid family leave and affordable prescription drugs, her advocacy is deeply personal and profoundly impactful.

Toni's passion for advocacy and caregiving has transformed lives, not just in Minnesota but across the country. Toni embodies courage in every sense of the word. This year's Kyle Woody Courage Award goes to Toni Kay Mangskau!


I met Julie Niewald at our ambitious and equally successful CaregiverCON last fall. Julie's husband Steve uses a wheelchair due to a bike accident. He went from being an active retiree, to what Jack's refers to as a "Caregetter", needing 24/7 care from Julie. I was charged with greeting attendees at the street level entrance. Julie arrived shortly before the event, feeling alone and not knowing what to expect. She was hoping for some kind of connection. What she found after climbing three flights of stairs was a room full of Caregivers who were seeking the same thing. She shares, "I was overwhelmed with gratitude for the first time." The event helped Julie feel less alone and she knew she was in a room of like-minded, brave Caregivers and organizations like Jack's that were there to help. "I was in a room of caregivers who understand that healing isn't on a straight trajectory and that Caregivers need Caregivers."

Julie found Jack's that day. She experienced our Caregiver Klatch (Jack's brand of support group, led by Dan Cramer). She basked in both Priscilla Momah's Somatic Serenade and a feeling of solidarity with fellow Caregivers. She spent time with a therapy dog and met with the good folks at Open Arms, which opened the door for her to ask for help from her family. I don't think I'm overselling things when I say... Julie is a believer.

Cathy Krier recently attended our monthly Caregiver Klatch. Our Klatches aren't usually centered around advice, but Kathy needed some practical support to validate her frustration as a caregiver. A roadblock at a pharmacy that day seemed to be a defining moment for her. And how to approach the delicate topic of transitioning from palliative care to hospice with the various members of her family who each had different needs. What she received was confirmation of her instincts and feelings about past plans and an uncertain future.

Less than a month later Jeff Myhre received this text message from Cathy:

Hi Jeff- Just wanted to reiterate how meaningful it was to attend the last Klatch.

Presently, I am a bit of a fish out of water as I miss my best friend (he passed last Friday).

But the fam and I are adjusting.

It is a humble privilege to witness Caregivers supporting one another and receiving encouragement at the same time. If you haven't experienced a Klatch, we have our Caregiver Klatches on the First Thursday of the month. Sequel Maker Klatch is the 3rd Wednesday, and look for the pilot for our online Caregiver Klatch coming May 29th, 2025!

At Jack's Caregiver Coalition, we believe no Caregiver should have to weather their storms alone. These are the moments when we show up—often during a time of crisis—with our mobile kitchen, The Storm Chaser. We cook fresh, delicious meals and gather with the Caregiver's family, not just to feed their bodies, but to nourish their spirits. We show up as fellow Caregivers, people who truly understand the weight of the moment.

One of the most powerful ways we share our mission is through the Storm Chase Experience. The experience helps donors feel our mission. It's an opportunity for your friends, family, and colleagues to feel the heart of Jack's—and to see what happens when we choose to drive into a storm. When a supporter hosts an experience, they invite friends into a behind-the-scenes look at what it's like to engage in a real storm chase.


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





FINANCIALS
